We must renew our zeal to do whatever God is asking of us. If you are suffering from sloth, reboot by forcing yourself to pray, forcing yourself to come to Church weekly, forcing yourself to listen to the people around you. God is speaking. God is alive. God is constantly making known to us our mission. We simply have to be willing to ofollow himo. Having zeal for what God is asking of us is huge. Living daily as a õSpiritual Couch Potatoö is õreallyö not worth it. Find, discover and live out of a zeal for what the Lord is asking of you.




